E-Invoice Metrics 2024 (summary)

Finland continues to lead globally in e-invoicing adoption. The State Treasury has published its fifth e-invoice metrics, tracking invoice volumes since 2020. In 2024, electronic invoice volumes reached a record 325 million, with notable growth in consumer e-invoicing (+7%). B2B volumes are stabilizing, indicating market maturity.

The metrics now include B2B, B2C, portal-based, and manual invoices. EDIFACT traffic is excluded due to its limited visibility. The number of organizations in the national e-invoicing registry has grown to 355,000. Peppol transactions rose 55% in 2024, totalling nearly 485,000. Most are invoices, but order volumes are increasing. Public sector data shows strong digitalization, though its share of B2B invoicing is only 7%. Still, most companies interact with the public sector, making it a key driver of e-invoicing readiness. EN16931-compliant invoices reduce errors and support automation. Upcoming EU legislation (ViDA directive) will mandate e-invoicing for cross-border trade by 2030. Format updates and system readiness are essential.

Consumer invoicing is evolving, with new services from Siirto and MobilePay lowering adoption barriers. Future development will focus on improving end-to-end invoicing processes, enabling automation and better data flow across systems.
